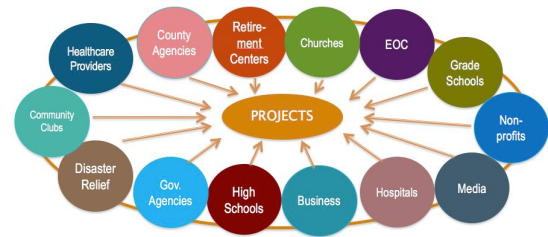
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How Clay SafetyNet works

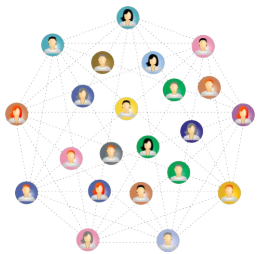
One network. Shared information. Practical projects.

The problem Clay SafetyNet was built to solve

- Families and providers do not always know which services exist.
- Organizations can duplicate services, wasting limited resources.
- Long-term dependence can grow when services do not connect people to next steps.
- Many agencies can only guide clients within one service area.
- Some essential services do not exist until stakeholders build them together.



The working model



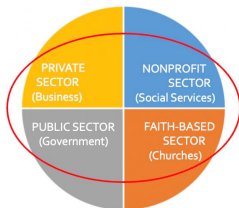
Monthly social service network

Monthly meetings allow for a speaker or panel, while partners communicate services, share organizational needs, and reduce duplicated effort.



Countywide project support

Data, champions, and leadership support help move needed projects from a gap to a plan.



Four-sector leadership

Government, business, nonprofit, and faith-based leaders rally resources and public support.

A local success

In 2010, Clay County Schools reported 963 children with no fixed address. Alliance members helped fund hotel stays, rent the first group home, and build support for Mercy Support Services. By 2014, families moved into supportive homes. And today they have broken ground on Mercy Village. A community of 34 supportive housing units focused on transforming lives of individuals, families and young adults experiencing or facing homelessness.
